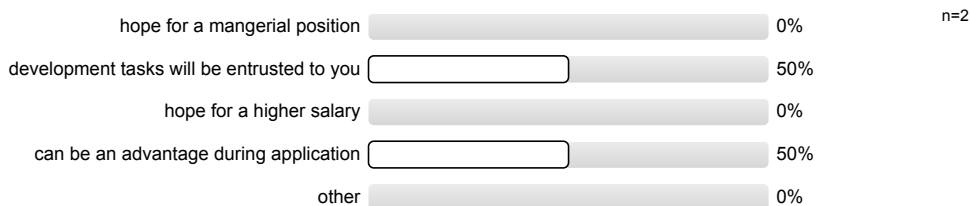

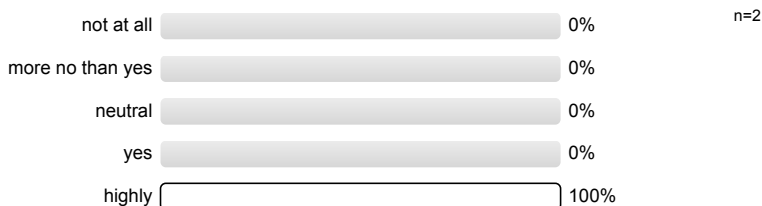

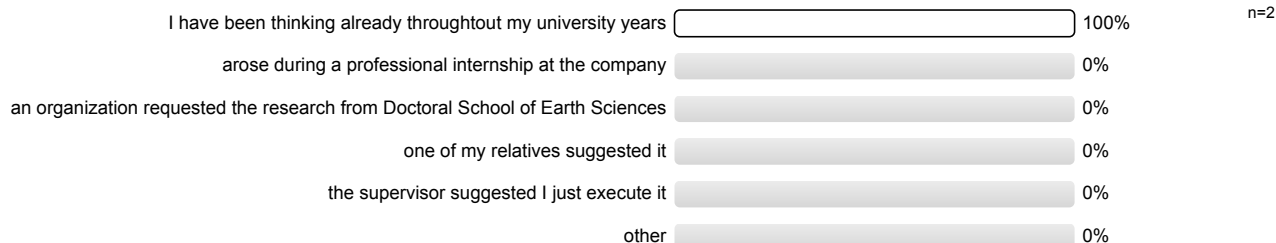
1.1) What motivated you to pursue a phd?



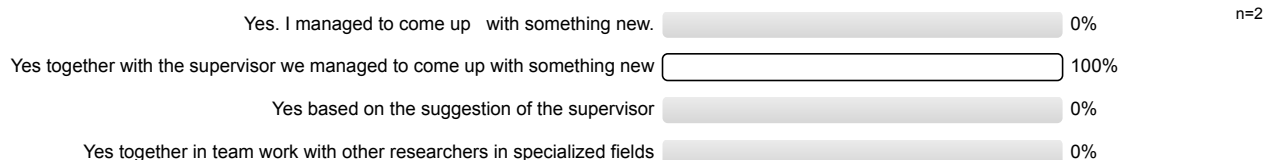
1.3) Are you satisfied with the training provided by the Doctoral School of Earth Sciences?



1.4) How did you decide about which research topic you select?



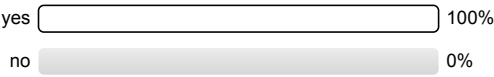
1.6) Did innovation happen during the research?
